Phil has over 25 years of experience in the wood manufacturing sector. Much of this experience was gained during his employment with Palliser Furniture, located in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Phil became involved in Palliser's Lean Manufacturing Initiatives, after implementing the Basic Lean Initiatives at their head office in Winnipeg. He was charged with the start-up of a large case goods and upholstery division in North Carolina in 1991. It was there he Phil received in-depth Lean Manufacturing Principles Training through UNC (University of North Carolina) and transformed the Troutman, North Carolina facility into a true Lean environment.

In 1997, Phil returned to Winnipeg to introduce and implement the Lean principles at a cabinet/millwork facility located in Steinbach, Manitoba.

In 2003, Phil joined FPIInnovations as an Industry Advisor and he has recently taken on the role of Lean Champion.

Recognizing that TWI is fundamental in supporting Lean manufacturing principles, Phil was trained and certified by the TWI institute and has since received his SME/Shingo Bronze Lean and TWI JITT and JRTT Certifications.

He continues to work with, and educate secondary wood manufacturers across Canada, in their journey to Lean Thinking/TWI Training and Implementation.

Overview of TWI and the "J" Programs

In the "The Toyota Way" field book, Jeffrey Liker and David Meier state, "The Toyota method for training is tried and true, and they have used it (Training Within Industry-TWI) for over 50 years." This seminar will explain TWI from the time it was created during WWII, the impact it had on the outcome of that war, and why TWI was dropped in the US after the war only to end up in Japan where the program became a cornerstone of the "Japanese industrial miracle" known as Kaizen. A detailed overview of the three "J" components of job relations (JR), Job instruction (JI), and Job Methods Improvement (JM) will focus on the 4-step method common to all three programs. A hands-on demonstration of JI program will remove any doubts about why the TWI 4-step training method has not changed in over 60 years, even at Toyota.

You will learn how JR can create a positive work environment, how JI provides a sure way to train a person providing a foundation for standard work, and how JM involves the people who do the work to continuously improve.

Those attending will also walk away from this seminar with a clear understanding on why TWI is referred to today as "the missing link to lean."
